2. All llamas must be accompanied by a health certificate issued within **30** days of the final day of the event. Exam must include inspection for spineless ear ticks.
3. All exhibitors are required to pay a stall fee of \$20.00 per stall (**Limit** of 3 llamas per stall) and a \$19.00 entry fee for every class in which each animal is entered.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for ALSA, ILR & other local and state rules that govern this fair.
5. This is an ALSA & ILR Sanctioned Show. In accordance with ALSA & ILR rules, any exhibitor who is not an ALSA & ILR member must pay a \$30.00 fee at check in time.
6. All breeding llamas 13 months and older entered in approved classes, with the exception of youth classes, must be registered or have passed screening with the International Llama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). Non-Breeder llamas do not have to be registered or have passed screening with the ILR or the CLRC except those recorded with ALSA and participating in the Award System. Breeding llamas entered in the 5 months through 12 months age sections must be registered and present papers. **Copies of registration papers must be sent in with entry form.**
7. Exhibitors must be registered owners and make entries in the exact names (owner & llama) as shown on the registration certificate. Exhibitors may or may not be handlers.
8. 1st and 2nd place winners compete for grand and reserve grand champion classes.
9. All animals entering the show must compete (show) in at least one class or may be asked to leave the Fairgrounds.
10. Age for juniors will be determined as follows: 8 years old shall be determined as of individuals birthday. 9 years & up shall be determined as of January 1.

RULES

1. **SHOW CHAIRMEN:** Kevin Kress 707-996-6673, goatesq@aol.com, Sierra Pacific Pygmy Goat Assoc.
2. Shows are sanctioned by the National Pygmy Goat Assn. NPGA rules to govern and take precedence over all others. California State rules to govern in the absence of an NPGA rule.
3. **REGISTRATION PAPERS:** All animals except wethers must be registered, have a registration certificate, or a registration certificate with a transfer of ownership less than 90 days old. Papers may be checked at Entry Office, Administration Building on the fairgrounds prior to show; then at Livestock Office during the show.
4. Animals must be entered in individual classes to qualify for group and showmanship classes.
5. No animals will be permitted on the grounds that show any evidence of abscesses or other illness as determined by the show committee.
6. No does will be permitted in show barn that are in labor, or that have kidded recently enough so that they are discharging.
7. No breeding in barn area, or in view of the public.

8. All goats must be entered in the show to qualify for pen space, except kids under two months of age. An area will be assigned for tack storage. Pens are large enough for 3-4 adult does. Bucks will be housed in a different area of the barn. Please use as few pens as possible. Owners of fence jumpers must bring your own pen covers. List the number of doe and buck pens needed on your entry form.
9. STATE RULE: A \$5 penalty must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by the exhibitor in excess of 2 in the section.
10. Livestock releases must be obtained from show chairmen before animals will be released from fairgrounds.
11. Camping is available, however, camping is at exhibitors own risk. The Sonoma County Harvest Fair does not take any responsibility for campers and/or their belongings.
12. **NEW:** Fair will not provide bedding. Straw only, no shavings allowed.

SHOWMANSHIP

RULES:

1. Exhibitor's age is as of opening day of fair.
2. Entry fee required (except mini, class 1), premiums paid 1st through 5th in each class.
3. Showmanship not offered Friday.
4. Each animal must be exhibited in its appropriate class and be owned by the exhibitor to be eligible for showmanship, except assisted mini.
5. Showmanship class must be pre-entered (except mini, class 1). Limit – 1 entry (class) per exhibitor.
6. The novice class is for showpersons 10 & under who have never won a first place ribbon in showmanship at any show. (All those who have and are 10 & under must enter the junior showmanship class)
7. The first place winner of the preceding class can move up to the next class to compete in that class. One person could move up several times if they continue to win first place (except mini showpersons).
8. No bucks allowed in showmanship.
